Bucks-La Salle Dual Admission Students: Please refer to the Dual Admission application for eligibility requirements. Students interested in applying to La Salle through the Dual Admission program must sign the Dual Admission Application before completing 45 college-level credits. The Dual Admission Agreement includes a Core-to-Core component. Under the Dual Admission agreement, La Salle University's Core will essentially be fulfilled by the Core at Bucks County Community College. In order to meet the requirements of La Salle's Core, students must take **CORE Qualifiers** – one Philosophy course, one Religion course and one Computer Science course – at La Salle if they have not taken courses at Bucks that will fulfill these requirements. See recommendations on the reverse side under "Advising Notes Related to Core Qualifiers" for which specific Bucks courses will fulfill these requirements.

Non-Dual Admission students who transfer to La Salle University will be required to meet the complete La Salle Core, which includes two Religion courses, two Philosophy courses and one Computer Science course, among others. The courses recommended on this Transfer Guide will better prepare students for transfer to La Salle University.

La Salle will accept credit on a case by case basis earned through one of the following sources: the College Level Examination Program (CLEP), the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support Program (DANTES) and in accordance with the recommendations of the American Council on Education (ACE).

IMPORTANT NOTES ON OTHER SIDE

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Advising Notes Related to Core Qualifiers – For Dual Admission Students:

- 1) Students may take any Philosophy (PHIL) course as an additional course at Bucks if they wish to satisfy La Salle's Philosophy Core Qualifier.
- 2) Students may take one of the following Religion courses as an additional course at Bucks if they wish to satisfy La Salle's Religion Core Qualifier: HUMN120, HUMN121, HUMN122, HUMN125, HUMN127, HUMN128, HUMN129.
- 3) Students may take CISC100 Introduction to Computers or CISC110 Introduction to Information Systems as an additional course at Bucks to satisfy La Salle's Computer Science Core Qualifier.

Advising Notes Related to Major Course Requirements:

- 1) Students must take CRIJ100 as a prerequisite (C or better) or as a co-requisite for the Criminal Justice Electives.
- 2) For the **Criminal Justice Electives**, it is recommended to take CRIJ275 Introduction to Correctional Administration to satisfy La Salle's CRJ 326 Institutional and Community Corrections, and CRIJ250 Police Organization and Administration to satisfy CRJ 324 Policing: Theory and Dynamics, both major requirements at La Salle. Also, CRIJ115 Outlaw Gangs, 120 Criminal Evidence, 140 Criminal Procedure, 210 Terrorism and 220 Psychology for Law Enforcement will transfer as major-level Criminal Justice elective credit.
- 3) For the **Criminal Justice Electives**, students have the option to choose any elective within Criminal Justice (except please note CRIJ280 Cooperative Education will not transfer) or other courses outside of Criminal Justice with prior written approval from the Criminal Justice Coordinator or the Assistant Academic Dean. If such approval is obtained to take POLI111 American National Government, it will satisfy a major requirement at La Salle.
- 4) Criminal Justice students should not take Bucks CRIJ230, 260, 270 and 285. These will not transfer as CRJ courses, and at best will be general electives.

Additional Notes:

- 1) The maximum number of credits that a student may transfer to La Salle is 70. Additional courses beyond the Associate degree can be taken at Bucks to meet program requirements at La Salle.
- 2) **A transfer student must complete at least half the major courses at La Salle.**
- 3) Students are strongly advised to use this guide with the assistance of Transfer Services at Bucks. The information in this transfer guide is subject to change. Therefore, students are advised to check periodically with Transfer Services for up-to-date information and to contact the Assistant Dean at La Salle, listed below, for advisement on major requirements that can be taken at Bucks. Following this guide does not guarantee the transfer of credit or admission to La Salle University.
