The Academic Intervention Team (AIT) is available to Faculty and Staff at Bucks County Community College to issue alerts for struggling students. The AIT allows you to submit a concern you have about a current student's ability to academically succeed.

Your Rights as a Faculty Member

You have the right to direct students to cease disruptive classroom behavior immediately. If it becomes necessary, you can direct a student to leave your classroom for the rest of the class period. If they fail to comply with your directives to leave the classroom, promptly report their failure to do so to Security, and ask to remove the student from your classroom. Depending on the severity of the situation, an option may be to dismiss the class.
