Gardens and Photography: An Old Mix or a New Match?



Whatever one's response to the above question, all can agree the two arts frequently combine to create a remarkable lasting effect.

A photographer's best efforts to capture extraordinary garden beauty – particularly when collected and bound in unforgettable coffee tabletop books – can always be relied on to preserve gardens at their peak.

During the April 25 lecture, one of the best-known photographers in the country as well as Photography Director-tor of the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society, Rob Cardillo, will

speak on "The Creative Eye: Secrets and Lies in Photographing Gardens." He will illustrate the crafting of sweeping landscape portraits and compelling plant close-ups through engaging and instructive stories. And, if you prefer an iPhone, he will share new tools and ideas to help you find and translate your garden experiences into a photographic vision of your personal "Eden."

Cardillo has garnered top honors from the American Horticultural Society and the Garden Writers Association, and exhibited photographs in Mother Earth News, Garden Design and more than six books.

The lecture will begin at 10 a.m. on Saturday, April 25, in the Zlock Performing Arts Center on the Newtown Campus of Bucks County Community College. A tour of Tyler Formal Gardens is included in the ticket price, plus a raffle for tickets to Chanticleer Garden will be held during the event.

Since 1999, volunteers have toiled to return Tyler Formal Gardens to their illustrious past. The fruits of this labor of love are reflected in the gardens' appearance and popularity. In 2019, the college replaced the courtyard's flagstone walkway with stamped concrete and added new signage describing Stella Tyler's art. The double dogleg staircase leading to gardens' first level was repaired by Behrle Custom Landscapes LLC. In addition, given the increasing number of visitors to the gardens, wrought-iron railings were added to the staircases leading to the tennis court level, along with a decorative border fence around the tennis court wall's flower bed, all completed by Iron Art & Design of New Holland, Pa.
