



Yes, I would recommend the AESL program to new students. I started my classes at Bucks last semester and today I feel more confident with all that I have learned.

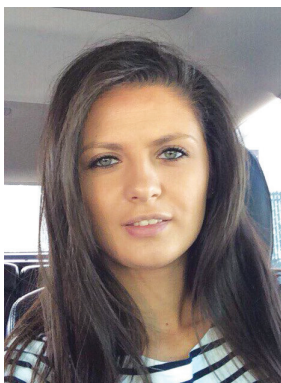
