Additional Information for the School of Education:

A. <u>Required Clearances for Field Experiences</u>

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's School Code requires that students in teacher preparation programs have current background checks prior to entering a school building for the purpose of any field experience, classroom observation, practicum experience, and student teaching. Prior to beginning courses at any level, Holy Family University students must upload copies of the following documents to American Data Bank (http://www.holyfamilycompliance.com):

- 1. Tuberculosis (PPD) Test
- 2. Pennsylvania Child Abuse Clearance (Act 151)
- 3. Pennsylvania Criminal History Background Check (Act 34)
- 4. Federal Criminal History Record/Fingerprinting (Act 114)
- 5. Arrest/Conviction Report and Certification Form (Act 24)

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Students are to retain the originals of all documents in their possession. Documents should be secured in a safe place where they can be easily retrieved when needed. Students should be prepared to produce any of the preceding documents at school or district sites when requested. Each document must be current and upto-date in accordance with University guidelines. Maintaining current documents will require students to obtain and upload all clearances on a yearly basis.

B. Teacher Preparation Program Admission Requirements

All current requirements for admission to the Professional Educator Programs at Holy Family University (including transfer students) are outlined in the University's Undergraduate Studies Catalog. Admission requirements are subject to change based on regulations issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and policies developed by the School of Education at Holy Family University.

Current admission requirements (as stated in the 2014 – 2015 Undergraduate Studies Catalog) include the following:

- 1. Completed a minimum of 48 semester credit hours of university-level coursework.
- 2. Proof of all current clearances listed above in Section A.
- **3.** Fulfillment of the Basic Skills requirement as specified by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Additional detailed information about Pennsylvania testing requirements is provided on the School of Education website at www.HolyFamily.edu.
- 4. A Cumulative GPA of at least 2.8. (Please note that a Cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 must be obtained by the completion of the program to qualify for Pennsylvania teacher certification.)
- 5. Completion of at least six semester credits in university-level Mathematics, with a minimum grade of C, and at least six semester credits in university-level English Composition and approved Literature, with a minimum grade of C.
- 6. Two recommendation letters from Higher Education faculty members. These letters may be provided by faculty members at BCCC.
