# **General Information**

1. Is on-campus housing available for transfer students? **Yes** Cost? \*\*Housing: \$8,422 (New Jersey and Non-New Jersey residents) \*\*Housing and meal plans vary depending on choice; costs shown are averages.

2. Full-time tuition: New Jersey resident- \* Tuition: \$11,619, Non-New Jersey resident- \*Tuition: \$27,042 \*Tuition and Fees will vary according to school or college.

Part-time tuition: Varies per credit and in-state vs. out of state 
Is evening tuition different? There is no evening tuition specifically, only full or part-time and it is based on the school choice attended as well.

- 3. Scholarship availability for transfer students: Yes, we offer merit scholarships.
- 4. Can a transfer student with an associate degree normally expect to receive the baccalaureate degree in two years? **Yes, but it is not a guarantee.**
- 5. Can a transfer student complete baccalaureate programs on an evening schedule? Yes If so, in what programs? Mostly for off-campus programs, especially if all evening is preferred

## Transfer Requirements

- 1. Best time(s) to apply? Priority deadlines are Oct. 1 for spring, Feb. 1 for fall. We are rolling admissions after that point and accept applications on a space available basis.
- 2. What grade point average (4.0 scale) do you consider? **Generally, a minimum of 2.8 GPA for most on campus programs, 2.5 for off-campus programs, and at least a 3.0 for Traditional BSN Program and Accelerated Nursing Program.** Prefer?
- 3. If different averages are required for different curricula, please specify: **Please see above. Overall, we use a holistic review approach.**
- 4. Do you accept GPA as calculated by previous college or do you re-calculate? **For admissions review, we use the previous cum. GPA.** Once a student is admitted, they start here with a clean slate of 0.00 GPA.
- 5. Maximum number of credits accepted in transfer: Up to 60 credits from a community college and 90 credits from a 4-year university
- 6. When does the applicant learn which credits will be accepted in transfer? **Typically, students will find out how many of their credits have transferred once they are admitted and receive an official credit evaluation from our Office of New Student Programs, who handles all next steps.**
- 7. Must the SAT or ACT scores be submitted by transfer students? No, only if the student has less than 12 credits and/or graduated high school within the past two years.
- 8. Must high school transcripts or GED be submitted by students with an associate degree? No, if a student has at least 24 credits, high school credentials are not required.
  Without the degree but with 30 credits or more? No
  With less than 30 credits? No
- 9. Is the transfer student required to have had the same high school courses (e.g. foreign language, math) as entering freshman? Yes, however, we do not check for them. As stated before, we do not require high school credentials if they have 24 credits or more.

If yes, can these be satisfied by college courses? Yes, most of the time and/or waived by the institution on a case by case basis. Will these courses also be credited toward the baccalaureate? Yes, once they are evaluated.

- 10. Are D's transferable? No, D grades are not transferrable. If it is a requirement for a program and degree, the student will need to retake it. With an AA degree? No Without an AA degree? No Explain.
- 11. Do you accept Prior Learning Assessment (AP, CLEP, credit by certifications or portfolio, etc.) which may appear on the Bucks transcript? Yes, that is evaluated by the Office of New Student Programs after the student is admitted.

#### **Programs**

- 1. Which programs, if any, are closed to transfer students? B.S./D.O. (only first-year applicants) and the Accelerated Nursing Program, only open to students that hold a Bachelor's Degree.
- 2. Popular majors: Nursing, Psychology, Criminal Justice, Social Work, Health Sciences, Management, and Accounting.
- 3. New or distinctive majors: Gender Studies (major and minor)
