**Notes:** The English major at Temple University consists of 36 credits. Per the CLA Residency Requirement, students must complete at least half of major credits (18) at TU.

- Students should select one of the following courses: MATH101, 115, 120, 122, 125, or 140.
- Students should select one of the following courses: ECON111, GEOG110, PSYC110, or SOCI110.
- Bucks equivalents of TU courses ENG 2301, 2201, 2202 and 2302 can be applied to the current English major at TU, effective fall 2017.
- Students should select one of the following courses: SCIE103, BIOL101, CHEM101, or PHYS106.
- Students should select HIST 112: Ancient World. This course transfers to Temple as HIST 1301: Modern Europe and will partially satisfy the CLA Foreign Language/Global Studies requirement. Students who do not complete HIST 112 will need to complete one of the following at Temple: a third semester of foreign language; one Global Studies course; study abroad at an approved program; or take a GenEd Global/World Society course.
- The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires all students to complete at least two levels of a foreign language. A 110 level foreign language course at Bucks will partially fulfill this requirement. (American Sign Language will not satisfy this requirement.)
- The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires all students to complete at least two levels of the same foreign language. A 111 level foreign language course at Bucks will satisfy this requirement. (American Sign Language will not satisfy this requirement.)

a) To earn a CLA baccalaureate degree, a student must complete a minimum of 123 credits, including: 90 credits in CLA/CST courses, 45 credits of which must be at the upper level (numbered 2000-4999). Of that, 6 credits must be outside the student's major division (e.g. Social Sciences or Humanities). (See transfer policies c & d below for more information),		
b) Students that did not take HIST 112 at Bucks should select one of the following: a third semester of foreign language; take one Global Studies course; study abroad at an approved program; or take a GenEd Global/World Society course.		
c) Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete <a href="#">45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program</a> as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.		
d) Per Temple's Transfer Policy for <a href="#">Permission to Complete a Course at Another Institution after Matriculation</a> , students who transfer 60 credits or more cannot receive permissions to transfer additional course work.
