<u>(a)</u> In order to have this course fulfill an approved Criminal Justice elective at Bucks, the student MUST obtain the written approval from the Criminal Justice Coordinator or the Assistant Academic Dean.

+ The student may select from any two (2) from the following courses to the indicated CRJI Elective course in the Criminal Justice program at Bucks County Community College. The course selected will determine how the course applies within the CRJU program at Holy Family University. Note: Those courses with an (*) indicate a <u>required course in the CRJU major at Holy Family</u>. It is strongly recommended at the required courses in the major be given the primary consideration.

NOTE: There are a total of five (5) CRJU Elective in the Holy Family University degree program. Three of those five are already fulfilled by required courses in CRJI in the Bucks Criminal Justice program. (CRJI 110, CRJI 130, CRJI160)

Students must contact Faculty internship instructor prior to registration for internship.
