Students transferring through the Dual Admission Agreement and attending La Salle full time should be able to finish in 2 years, with the exception of Nursing, which would take 3 years
- 5. Can a transfer student complete baccalaureate programs on an evening schedule? **Yes**If so, in what programs? Social Work, Psychology, Criminal Justice, Information Technology, Religion, Accounting, Business Administration, and Nursing. Online: Organizational Leadership, RN-to-BSN

Transfer Requirements

- 1. Best time(s) to apply? By December 1st for Spring and August 1st for Fall
- 2. Deadline(s): Rolling Nursing students priority deadline is February 1st
- 3. What grade point average (4.0 scale) do you consider? 2.5 and above (exceptions listed in #4) Prefer? 2.75 and above
- 4. If different averages are required for different curricula, please specify: Nursing applicants MUST possess a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 & Science GPA of 3.0; Nutrition applicants: cumulative GPA 2.75 and Science GPA 2.75; Communication Sciences & Disorders applicants: GPA 3.2 minimum; All other Science applicants should have a 2.75. Education applicants should possess a 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- Do you accept GPA as calculated by previous college or do you re-calculate? We accept previous college GPA when reviewing for admission.
- 6. Maximum number of credits accepted in transfer: 70
- 7. When does the applicant learn which credits will be accepted in transfer? When accepted, they receive a preliminary credit evaluation.
- 8. Must the SAT or ACT scores be submitted by transfer students? Non-Nursing applicants must submit them if they have less than 30 earned credits. Nursing applicants who have taken them within the past 3 yrs & have scored a minimum of 1080 (critical reading plus math) should submit those scores to be waived out of taking the ATI-TEAS entrance exam
- 9. Must high school transcripts or GED be submitted by students with an associate degree? **Applicants to the School of Nursing and Health Sciences (SNHS)** are the only students required to submit their HS transcripts with an associate's degree. Without the degree but with 30 credits or more? **Only if applying to the SNHS**. With less than 30 credits? **Yes, all applicants with less than 30 credits must submit their high school transcript & SAT or ACT scores.**
- 10. Is the transfer student required to have had the same high school courses (e.g. foreign language, math) as entering freshman? **Yes**If yes, can these be satisfied by college courses? **Yes**Will these courses also be credited toward the baccalaureate? **Yes**
- 11. Are D's transferable? Only for students accepted through the Dual Admission Agreement, if earned in non-major courses. All non-dual admits or students who obtain a 'D' in a major course, will not obtain credit for that course.

- 13. Do you accept Prior Learning Assessment (AP, CLEP, credit by certifications or portfolio, etc.) which may appear on the Bucks transcript? Prior Learning Assessment must be evaluated by our Dean's Office to determine eligibility for credit.

Additional Information

For full-time clinical-ready day Nursing applicants: APPLICATION DEADLINE: February 1 for fall start term. In order to qualify for La Salle's Nursing program, students must complete a minimum of 60 required credits, possess a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and a science GPA of 3.0. Students are permitted to repeat (1) science (1) time in order to obtain that science GPA. Students who repeat two or more Science courses are automatically disqualified for admission. All applicants MUST complete all science preq's by the end of their spring semester prior to their transfer in the fall. As an additional requirement for admission, all nursing applicants must have taken a standardized test of English and Math within the past three years or the ATI-TEAS entrance exam will be required. Students must have received a qualifying score of 1080 on the SAT (critical reading plus math) or ACT (composite score of 21) within the past three years in order to be waived out of the TEAS nursing entrance exam. Any student who has not taken the SAT or ACT or whose score will not qualify will be required to take the TEAS entrance exam before February 1, for consideration. Applicants must meet the standardized benchmark on the TEAS exam in order to be considered for admission.
