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General Information

1. Is on-campus housing available for transfer students? yes Cost? \$15,566 (includes room and board)

2. Full-time tuition: \$41,622 Part-time tuition: \$20,910 Is evening tuition different? No. There are very few evening classes.

3. Scholarship availability for transfer students:

Merit awards for transfer students range from \$5,000 per year to \$16,000 per year. We also have a few named scholarships for transfer students, in addition to a competitive academic scholarship for transfer students interested in pursuing a self-directed course of academic research. This scholarship is called the Visionary Women's Honors Program.

4. Can a transfer student with an associate degree normally expect to receive the baccalaureate degree in two years?

It depends completely on what their transferable coursework is, but it is possible. We evaluate each credit course an accepted transfer student has taken, to award credit for a comparable required course for their degree at Moore, or for elective credit. Students must receive a C or higher in the course to be awarded transfer credit, and must show coursework completed in any studio art classes to be considered for transfer credit. If a student is interested in transferring, it will be most beneficial for them to contact us ASAP so I can advise what courses Bucks offers that are

likely to transfer.

5. Can a transfer student complete baccalaureate programs on an evening schedule? If so, in what programs?

There are very few evening courses offered, students should expect their classes to happen between Mon-Fri 9am-5pm.

Transfer Requirements

- 1. Best time(s) to apply? Recommended application submission date for Fall students is by or before March 1st of that year. (Apply by March 1, 2019 for anticipated enrollment of August 2019). Spring students should apply by November 1st (Apply by November 1st, 2018 for January 2019 enrollment). We have rolling admissions, so we counsel new applicants up to the start of each semester, and are still taking new applicants for Fall 2018.
- 2. What grade point average (4.0 scale) do you consider? **2.0**+ Prefer? **3.0**+
- 3. If different averages are required for different curricula, please specify: n/a
- 4. Do you accept GPA as calculated by previous college or do you re-calculate? **We accept the GPA calculated by the previous college.**
- 5. Maximum number of credits accepted in transfer: **76.0**
- 6. When does the applicant learn which credits will be accepted in transfer? The transfer evaluation process is begun after the student successfully completes their application. All official transcripts must be received. In some cases a student may have to submit additional documentation of their studio art coursework for faculty review—the counselor would let them know if this is the case.
- 7. Must the SAT or ACT scores be submitted by transfer students? **no**
- 8. Must high school transcripts or GED be submitted by students with an associate degree? **no**Without the degree but with 30 credits or more? **yes**With less than 30 credits? **yes**
- 9. Is the transfer student required to have had the same high school courses (e.g. foreign language, math) as entering freshman? If yes, can these be satisfied by college courses? Will these courses also be credited toward the baccalaureate? The student is required to have completed whatever high school courses they needed to earn their high school diploma or equivalent.
