- 4. Can a transfer student with an associate degree normally expect to receive the baccalaureate degree in two years? It depends on what courses the student has taken and which program they are hoping to complete. For the best information, set up an appointment with Joe Schwartz, Transfer Coordinator, at 610-285-5041 or jws5223@psu.edu.
- 5. Can a transfer student complete baccalaureate programs on an evening schedule? Penn State Lehigh Valley offers some evening classes, but there are no completely evening-based degree programs.

Transfer Requirements

1. Best time(s) to apply? Penn State uses a modified rolling admission process for most programs. Recommended priority dates for transfer students are below. Applications received later than June or November will be considered on a space-available basis.

Fall admission: By June 30 Spring admission: By November 30

- 2. What grade point average (4.0 scale) do you consider? Minimum 2.0 GPA, though some majors have higher requirements.
- 3. If different averages are required for different curricula, please specify: Some programs completed at other campuses have higher GPA requirements. Please contact Joe Schwartz for more details.
- 4. Do you accept GPA as calculated by previous college or do you re-calculate? When we evaluate your transcript(s), we will recalculate your GPA as we calculate it for Penn State students. This means we count all grades with a C- or below in the GPA calculation, even if you've retaken a course.
- 5. Maximum number of credits accepted in transfer: For a bachelor's degree 36 of the last 60 credits must be completed at Penn State. For an associate's degree 18 of the last 30 credits must be completed at Penn State.
- 6. When does the applicant learn which credits will be accepted in transfer? Once a student is accepted to the University, the student will receive an evaluation of credits along with the offer letter. The academic unit to which the student has been admitted will determine how credits will be used to fulfill degree requirements in a student's program of study.

- 7. Must the SAT or ACT scores be submitted by transfer students? **SAT or ACT scores are not required if you have attempted 18 or more credits of college level coursework after your high school graduation.**
- 8. Must high school transcripts or GED be submitted by students with an associate degree? Yes. Penn State requires transfer applicants to submit their official high school transcript(s) or GED (regardless of age or time since high school). High School transcripts are only required to be submitted if a student choose to accept their offer of admission to Penn State. All transcripts must be sent directly from the high school (educational institution of origin) to Penn State to be considered official.

Without the degree but with 30 credits or more? Yes, after the student accepts their offer of admission to Penn State.

With less than 30 credits? Yes, For students who have attempted 18 or more credits of post-secondary coursework, a high school transcript is required only if the students wishes to accept their offer of admission from Penn State.

- 9. Is the transfer student required to have had the same high school courses (e.g. foreign language, math) as entering freshman? **Yes.** If yes, can these be satisfied by college courses? **Yes.** Will these courses also be credited toward the baccalaureate? **Yes, if the courses have direct equivalents at Penn State and if the courses can be used toward the degree program of interest.**
- 10. Are D's transferable? **No** With an AA degree? **No** Without an AA degree? **No** Explain. **The grade received** in the course must be equivalent to a C (2.0) or higher at Penn State.
- 11. Do you accept Prior Learning Assessment (AP, CLEP, credit by certifications or portfolio, etc.) which may appear on the Bucks transcript? Yes. Consult the following website to see how Penn State awards credit for prior learning: https://admissions.psu.edu/info/future/adult/credit/.
