Note 1: Penn State Abington's Business Degree has Options in Accounting, Financial Services, Health Services, Individualized Studies, and Marketing and Management. A separate major in Accounting is also available.

Note 2: ACCT 105 and ACCT 106 are *both* required to fulfill Penn State Abington's ACCTG211. The additional credits transfer as Electives.

Note 3: This major requires at least 9 credits in Electives.

Note 4: The Penn State Business and Accounting majors require 4 credits of Calculus. BCCC students can choose MATH 140 (which transfers as Penn State's MATH140), or they can choose MATH 117 and MATH 118, combined (the equivalent of Penn State's MATH110). For students taking MATH 117 and 118, the additional credits become Electives. See also Note 11, regarding Statistics.

Note 5: Students who took COMP 111 prior to July 2015 will receive credit for ENGL202B. Student who take it after July 2015 will receive no credit because the course transfers as COMP 110. COMP 111 is under review. Current Bucks CCC students should request permission to *substitute* COMP 114 for COMP 111 to receive credit for ENGL202C, Technical Writing. MGMT 135 has not yet been evaluated by Penn State

Note 6: Keep track to fulfill Penn State Abington's **General Education requirements** for these majors:

- o 6 credits in Arts
- o 6 credits in Humanities
- 6 credits in Social and Behavioral Sciences (fulfilled by ECON111 and 112)
- 3 credits Health and Physical Activity
- o 6 credits in Quantification (fulfilled by the Penn State major requirements)
- 9 credits in Natural Sciences
- 3 credits in United States Cultures can double count with the courses listed above (example: U.S. History= both Humanities and U.S. Cultures requirement)

Note 7: The Penn State Abington Division Head has substituted the three-credit BCCC course for Penn State Abington's four-credit requirement, BA243.

Note 8: Penn State suggests take HLTH 103, 110, 120, or 130 to fulfill the General Education, Health and Physical Activity requirement. Note that Penn State requires 3 credits in this area. See Note 6.

Note 9: Penn State suggests one of the following to fulfill General Education, Arts, requirement: COMT 101 or 103; MUSC 101, 105, or 106; VACV 142; VAFA 100, 107, 111, 141, 160, 161, 171, 181, 191, 192, 193, or 194. Also, one of these courses will also fulfill the U.S. Cultures requirement: MUSC 105, MUSC 106, or VAFA 194.

Note 10: BCCC says take one of the following: BIOL 101, 181; CHEM 101, PHYS 106, or SCIE 103.

Note 11: MATH 115 and 215, *combined*, are equivalent to Penn State's STAT 200, a required, 4-credit course. The additional credits become Electives. If MATH 115 is taken alone, it will count as an Elective.

Note12: Additional Policies: Transferable courses MUST have a grade of "C" or better. Developmental and remedial courses are NOT included in transferable credit. Course work from another college or university must be evaluated separately. Penn State Abington's degree requires a minimum 2.0 GPA for transfer as calculated by Penn State. Before admission, students must complete certain high school courses, including math and foreign language. See psu.edu/admissions/.
