Note 1: There are at least 18 credits of Electives in each of these majors and 9 credits of B.A Requirements in Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, Quantification, and Foreign Language. Penn State's Integrative Arts and Letters, Arts, and Sciences are flexible in the requirements for the major. Many courses in Communications Studies will fulfill the requirements for the Major, for Electives, for B.A. Requirements, or for General Electives, depending on the student's major.

Note 2: Keep track to fulfill Penn State Abington's General Education requirements for these majors:

- o 6 credits in Arts
- o 6 credits in Humanities
- 6 credits in Social and Behavioral Sciences
- 3 credits Health and Physical Activity
- o 6 credits in Quantification (with at least 3 credits in Mathematics or Statistics)
- 9 credits in Natural Sciences (at least *one course* with a lab)
- 3 credits in United States Cultures, 3 credits in Other Cultures, and 3 credits in International Cultures can double count with the courses listed above (example: U.S. History= both Humanities and U.S. Culture requirement; any Western Heritage History = both Humanities and International Cultures requirements; SOCI 120 = Social/Behavioral Sciences and Other Cultures requirements)

Note 3: Penn State suggests taking any one of the following courses: VAFA 191, VAFA 192, VAFA 193, VAFA 194, VAFA 196, FCUL 110, HIST 111, HIST 112, HIST 151, HIST 152, HUMN 111, HUMN 112, HUMN 113, HUMN 114, HUMN 120, LITR 205, LITR 206, LITR 231, LITR 232, LITR 254, LITR 255, LITR 261, LITR 271, LITR 275, LITR 177, LITR 278, LITR 129, MUSC 101, MUSC 105, MUSC 106, or PHIL 125. See Notes 2 and Note 4.

Note 4: Penn State's Foreign Language courses are 4 credits, and Penn State requires Foreign Language to the 12th credit level, Language 202. *Suggest* BCCC students take four semesters of the *same* Foreign Language: FREN, GRMN, or SPAN, or postpone Foreign Language study until enrolled at Penn State Abington.

Note 5: Refer to Note 2, and take any course from the Program Elective list.

Note 6: Take any course from this list (BIOL 101, BIOL 181, BIOL 182, CHEM 101, CHEM 121, PHYS 106, PHYS 107, SCIE 102, or SCIE 103).

Note 7: Additional Policies: Transferable courses MUST have a grade of "C" or better. Developmental and remedial courses are NOT included in transferable credit. Course work from another college or university must be evaluated separately. Penn State Abington's degree requires a minimum 2.0 GPA for transfer as calculated by Penn State.

Before admission, students must complete certain high school courses, including math and foreign language. See **psu.edu/admissions/.**
