Note 1: Keep track to fulfill Penn State Abington's **General Education requirements**:

- o 6 credits in Arts
- 6 credits in Humanities
- 6 credits in Social and Behavioral Sciences (fulfilled by major requirements in Sociology)
- 3 credits Health and Physical Activity
- 6 credits in Quantification (3 credits in Statistics fulfilled by the major; at least 3 credits in Mathematics needed)
- 9 credits in Natural Science
- 3 credits in Other Cultures (for the B.A.), and 3 credits in International Cultures (for B.A. and B.S.) can double count with the courses listed above (example: any Western Heritage History = both Humanities and International Cultures requirement; SOCI 120 = Social/Behavioral Science and Other Cultures)

Note 2: Students pursuing the **B.A.** in Criminal Justice take 11-15 credits of Electives; 9 credits of B.A. Requirement in Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, Quantification, or Foreign Language; and foreign language to the 12th-credit level (3 semesters at Penn State Abington). Students pursuing the **B.S.** in Criminal Justice take 14-18 credits of Electives and 12 credits of Skills Enhancement Courses in consultation with the advisor.

Note 3: Suggest CRIJ 140, 250, or 275 to fulfill Major requirements for the B.A. and B.S. (CRIMJ 220, 210, and 230 respectively). See the BCCC Criminal Justice Coordinator or the Assistant Academic Dean.

Note 3: Additional Policies: Transferable courses MUST have a grade of "C" or better. Developmental and remedial courses are NOT included in transferable credit. Course work from another college or university must be evaluated separately. Penn State Abington's degree requires a minimum 2.0 GPA for transfer as calculated by Penn State.

Before admission, students must complete certain high school courses, including math and foreign language. See **psu.edu/admissions/.**
