Note 1: : One of the following courses will meet both the BCCC and the Penn State requirements: BIOL 101, CHEM 101, CHEM 121, MATH 101, MATH 102, MATH 115, MATH 117, MATH 120, MATH 122, MATH 125, MATH 140, SCIE 101, SCIE 102, or SCIE 103. Four-credit courses in BIOL, CHEM, and SCIE fulfill Penn State's requirement for at least one lab science, mentioned in Note 2.

Note 2: Keep track to fulfill Penn State Abington's General Education requirements for these majors:

- 6 credits in Arts
- o 6 credits in Humanities
- 6 credits in Social and Behavioral Sciences
- 3 credits Health and Physical Activity
- o 6 credits in Quantification (with at least 3 credits in Mathematics or Statistics)
- o 9 credits in Natural Sciences (at least one course with a lab)
- 3 credits in United States Cultures, 3 credits in Other Cultures, and 3 credits in International Cultures can double count with the courses listed above (example: U.S. History= both Humanities and U.S. Cultures requirement; any Western Heritage History = both Humanities and International Cultures requirements; SOCI 120 = Social/Behavioral Science and Other Cultures requirements)

Note 3: Penn State suggests any course from this list: VAFA 191, VAFA 192, VAFA 193, VAFA 194, VACV 141, VACV 142, COMT 101, MUSC 101, or MUSC 105.

Note 4: Penn State's Foreign Language courses are 4 credits, and Penn State requires Foreign Language to the 12th credit level, Language 202. *Suggest* BCCC students take four semesters of the *same* Foreign Language: FREN, GRMN, or SPAN, or postpone Foreign Language study until enrolled at Penn State Abington.

Note 5: Take any 3- or 4- credit course in Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, or Natural Sciences.

Note 6: Penn State Abington's English, History, and Letters, Art, and Science majors are flexible. Each requires 9 credits of B.A. Requirement in in Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, Quantification, and Foreign Language. Students in these majors also take at least 12 credits of Electives. All Bucks courses in the Liberal Arts: General major will fulfill a Penn State requirement for the Major, as Elective, or as B.A. Requirement, depending on the student's Penn State major.

Note 7: To fulfill both the BCCC and the Penn State requirements, take one of the following: MATH 101, MATH 102, MATH 115, MATH 117, MATH 120, MATH 122, MATH 125, MATH 140.

Note 8: Any one of these courses will fulfill both the BCCC and the Penn State requirement. Note that Penn State requires 3 credits in Health and Physical Activity.

Note 9: Take any course from this list (BIOL 101, CHEM 101, CHEM 121, PHYS 106, PHYS 107, SCIE 102, or SCIE 103). Penn State has not evaluated BIOL 181 and BIOL 182.

Note 10: Take one course from this list: FCUL 110, HIST 111, HIST 112, HIST 151, or HIST 152.

Note 11: BCCC recommends one of the following courses: COMM 111, ECON 111, GEOG 110, MGMT 100, MUSC 103, POLI 111, PSYC 110, SOCI 110, *or* WMST 110. These courses will fulfill Penn State's requirement for General Education: Social and Behavioral Sciences, except WMST 110 is Humanities and MUSC 103 is Arts.

Note 12: Additional Policies: Transferable courses MUST have a grade of "C" or better. Developmental and remedial courses are NOT included in transferable credit. Course work from another college or university must be evaluated separately. Penn State Abington's degree requires a minimum 2.0 GPA for transfer as calculated by Penn State. Before admission, students must complete certain high school courses, including math and foreign language. See psu.edu/admissions/.
