Enhance – for Homeschoolers! *Coming in the Fall*

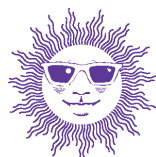
Do you want to learn the secrets of chocolate? How about taking part in a Poetry Jam? Be a CSI type forensic investigator? Create a fabulous piece of art?

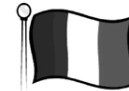

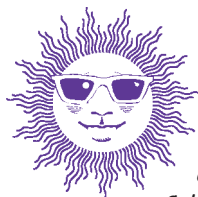
