Your Library Card—Check it Out

Begin by applying for your Community Library Card at the College Library's Circulation Desk. The normal loan period for books is 21 days, with up to 3 renewals if not requested by another borrower. Return your borrowed materials to one of the three BCCC libraries (Newtown, Upper Bucks Campus in Perkasie, or the Lower Bucks Campus in Bristol). Books returned late will result in a fine of \$.10/day. Additional charges may apply.

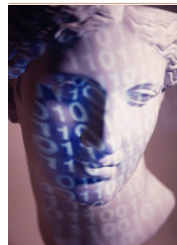

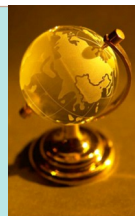
