



EMPLOYMENT and PLACEMENT RATE TRENDS

The Office of Research, Assessment, Data Analytics, and Reporting (RADAR) administers the Centurion Alumni Survey six months after students complete their program and graduate to allow time for them to secure employment. The results reported here are for students who graduated between August of 2021 and August of 2022.

POST-GRADUATION ACTIVITIES

Bucks County Community College offers a variety of associate degree programs and certificates. The degree programs are developed for one of two potential outcomes: 1) to prepare the student for employment, or 2) to prepare the student for transfer to a four-year college. For that reason, the employment statistics provided below are presented in two distinct categories, occupational programs and transfer programs. **Occupational programs** are designed primarily to prepare graduates for entry-level employment in positions which require both theoretical knowledge and practical skills. **Transfer programs** are designed to parallel the first two years of study in a variety of subject areas at the baccalaureate institutions to which our students most frequently transfer. FOR OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM GRADUATES

Employed	83.7%
Employed full time	55.8%
Employed in field related to field of study	64.9%
Felt coursework at Bucks prepared them for current position	90.3%

FOR TRANSFER PROGRAM GRADUATES

Felt coursework at Bucks prepared them for continuing their education	98.4%

Please note that the purpose of a transfer program is to prepare students to transfer to another institution to complete a baccalaureate degree. As noted above, most of these respondents are continuing their education. For this reason, employment for this population of students is typically lower than it is for students who are graduating from an occupational major and preparing for immediate entry into the workforce.
