## Things To Consider

- Online courses have specific start and end dates. Assignment schedules and due dates are determined by each instructor. Are you self-motivated and selfdisciplined? Are you able to keep yourself on-time and on-task?

If your course is using the Canvas system and you are unfamiliar with it, prior to the start of your course please visit the Canvas Basics course (no login required) at https://bucks. instructure.com/courses/36545 to learn about Canvas. You will have login access to Canvas approximately two weeks before classes begin. However, access to your online class will begin on the first day of classes and not before.
