Assignment:	Carefully read your assignment. Are you required to write about only causes, only effects, or both causes <i>and</i> effects?		
Logic:	Consider the logic of your ideas and the relationships among them. For instance, do not assume that an event or situation causes another simply because one follows the other in chronological order.		
Organization:	To sequence your ideas, use emphatic order (weakest to strongest cause/effect) or chronological order (time). Further, if your paper covers both causes <i>and</i> effects, you can shape the logic of your ideas in one of the following ways: 1. Inductively—proceeding from causes to effects		

2. Deductively—starting with effects and then discussing causes
