## COURSE OFFERINGS 16 HOUR CLASSES MARCH 16—17, 2019

### **PUMP OPERATIONS I**

**FSC 420.001**

**PUOP**

**PREREQUISITES: 1ST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose lines, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR**

### **RESPIRATORY PROTECTION II**

**FSC 0311.001**

**REPA**

**PREREQUISITES: 1ST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

Through classroom and Practical exercises, the student will become more confident with the use of the self contained breathing apparatus. With this advanced training, the student will learn air conservation and other skills needed to function in more challenging situations. This advanced training will enhance the fire fighters capabilities, build their confidence in using the apparatus and prepare them for the more complex situations that they may encounter (i.e. rapid intervention team and restrictive horizontal and vertical spaces)

### **TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS I**

**FSC 209.001**

**ATRC**

**PREREQUISITES: EBM OR EQUIVILANT / TRUCK I**

**MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA**

The student will be introduced to the basic concept of truck company operations as part of an organized, coordinated structural fire suppression operation. Truck companies, regardless of whether they arrive on an aerial device, squad, or engine, are the 'combat engineers' of fire attack operations. This course, for experienced fire fighters, will introduce the student to the basic concept of truck company operations and duties, including organizing the delivery of truck company

### **INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE ELIS**

**FSC 2459.001**

**PREREQUISITES: MUST BE 14 YEARS OF AGE BY FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR**

This entry level course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment, tools and emergency lighting, and backing apparatus. This is the first of five levels (courses) in the curriculum

### **Preparation for Initial Company Operations (PICO)**

**FSC 380.001**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER BY FIRST DAY OF CLASS Entry Level Fire Training (EBM, ELIF, BBFA, or FF-1)**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course is designed to prepare the student to function as a company officer, by developing the skills required to safely and successfully managing company tactical operations at structural fires. The first in the series of programs designed to meet the needs of fire officers and crew leaders with responsibilities to manage the operations of one or more companies in structural fire fighting operations. This course will provide a basic foundation for the management of one or more companies operating at a structure fire emergency. The focus of these five modules is a review of basic concepts and development of proficiency in critical skills. Key content includes Roles and Responsibilities, Readiness, Communication, Building Construction and Fire Behavior Factors, and Pre-incident Preparation. experienced officers.

### **INTRO TO FIREOFFICERSHIP (INFO)**

**FSC 0226.001 MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course will give those students wishing to become Fire Officers, the ability to function safely and effectively as a management component of a fire/rescue organization. Effective management skills and styles will be covered as well as effective communications, progressive discipline, philosophy of management, organizational skills, and Company Officer strategy and tactical considerations.

### **PUMP OPERATIONS II**

**FSC 421.001**

**PUOA**

**PREREQUISITES: PUOP AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

This course is designed to instruct the student in advanced techniques of operating pumps. Topics covered include friction loss, relay pumping, master streams and elevated master streams.

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR**

### **ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS**

**FSC 205.001**

**ECOP**

**PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING OR FF-1 CERT. MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA**

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

### **FORCIBLE ENTRY**

**FSC 700.001**

**TFE**

**PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER.**

**MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)**

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

**ATTENTION! THERE IS AN ADDITIONAL \$65.00 LAB FEE FOR EXPENDABLE ITEMS TO BE CUT AND FORCED FOR THIS PROGRAM. A TOTAL OF \$135.00 PER STUDENT TO ENROLL IS REQUIRED WHEN YOUR REGISTRATION FORM IS SUBMITTED.**

### **ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE II (RORA)**

**FSC 339.001**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA BY THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

Students in this course will be re-introduced to the various types of rescue equipment. Students will be trained in; mechanical advantage systems, safeties, basic ascending, basic rappelling technique and tie-offs with a rappel rack, rope changes, and one person rescue. The students will perform a low angle raise and lower evolution simulating patient transport on embankments. Most of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

**GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles) , CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS AND A CLASS III HARNESS. FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.**

**(Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)**

**STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.**

### **ADVANCED FIRE POLICE (AFPO)**

**FSC 0635.001 MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER**

**GEAR: NONE**

**This course expands on the knowledge, skills and abilities presented in the Basic Fire Police curriculum and provides fire police officers with more advanced training for leadership positions within fire police organizations. This course provides instructional review of the laws pertaining to fire police powers and the expected duties of a fire police officer to include health and safety and legal aspects of performance. Fire Police Officers will also be taught how to deal with people, how to manage incident response and leadership qualities. Tabletop scenarios will be presented to reinforce the lessons introduced in regards to incident management and response.**

**SATURDAY MORNING CLASSES**

**Water Rescue Awareness**

**FSC 0580.001 Class is on Saturday AM (3hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program discusses the characteristics of water-related emergencies and the health and safety risks to First Responders. This program addresses the common hazards associated with water rescue emergencies, as well as, the First Responder's initial role, on-scene responsibilities, and Responder limitations. This course will assist to increase the First Responder's ability to maintain scene/rescuer safety and control. During this program, students are introduced to important safety procedures related to weather exposure and physiological conditions, near drowning, personal protective equipment, including PFD (Personal Floatation Devices), and initial action plan development for water rescue emergencies will also be presented in this program.

**Dynamics of Emergency Vehicle Response (EVRD)**

**FSC 0186.001 Class is on Saturday AM (4hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course is designed as a supplement to and refresher for the prerequisite course *Emergency Vehicle Operators Course*. It reviews some basic principles of safe vehicle operation and introduces the concept of space and speed management in operation of any vehicle.

**Fire Dynamics Fundamentals**

**FSC 0800.001 Class is on Saturday AM ( 3hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course provides the firefighter the basic knowledge to reinforce the evidence based research conducted by Underwriters Laboratories, National Institute of Standards and Technology. Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms and other fire service organizations. This course introduces new terminology related to fire dynamics, legacy verse modern fuel loads, new construction techniques, flow paths, door control, and ventilation that all impact fire ground operations.

**Surface Ice Rescue Awareness (SIRA)**

**FSC 0447.001 Class is on Saturday PM (2.5hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

To goal of this program is to provide the student with the initial necessary knowledge for responding to ice immersion emergencies. Surface Ice Rescue Awareness will provide the student with the knowledge to size up an ice immersion emergency, provide for rescuer safety, provide site control and scene management and determine the necessary additional resources needed to mitigate the emergency. Surface Ice Rescue Awareness will assist an organization with becoming NFPA 1670 compliant with Ice Rescue Awareness.

**Traffic Incident Management (TIM)**

**FSC 0214.001 Class is on Saturday PM (4hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This National TIM Responder Training Program establishes the foundation and promotes consistent training for all responders to incident involving operations on or near a highway. The PA – TIM objectives primarily target operations and special risks to personnel performing fire, rescue and EMS functions. This program examines the risks and provides nationally recognized actions to minimize/reduce those risks.

**Fire Dynamics Strategy and Tactics**

**FSC 0801.001 Class is on Saturday PM ( 3hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course provides the firefighter the basic knowledge of strategy and tactics and how to apply the evidence based fire research conducted by Underwriters Laboratories, National Institute of Standards and Technology, Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms and other fire service organizations to fire ground operations. This course introduces new terminology related to fire dynamics, ventilation, flow paths, door control, transitional fire attack, basement fires, and new concepts for developing strategy and tactics.

**SATURDAY 8 HR CLASSES**

**CLANDESTINE DRUG LABS: OPERATIONS LEVEL**

**FSC 847.001 Class is on Saturday (8hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER, EBM OR ELIF OR BBFA OR FF1**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program addresses the safety considerations for emergency response actions for clandestine drug labs. This course brings to light the inherent dangers and exposure conditions often associated with these clandestine processes. This program will leave the student with a comprehensive overview of best practices defensive response actions in order to maintain responder safety.

**AUTOMATIC DETECTION AND SUPPRESSION SYSTEMS (AUTO)**

**FSC 525.001 Class is on SUNDAY (8hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course is designed to give the fire officer, fire prevention official, and code enforcement official a basic understanding of the design and operation of fire alarm and fix fire protection system.

**HEAVY TRUCK RESCUE (8 HR CLASS)**

**FSC 0622.001**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER,**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR**

This program addresses the hazards and resource demands for extrication emergencies involving large and heavy vehicles. Addressed in this program, are vehicle design considerations, weight distribution hazards, payloads, strength points, and special hazard considerations. The course teaches the student how to assess, stabilize, and access vehicles of greater size and weight. Students will learn how to address special resource needs encountered during extrication emergencies.

**SUNDAY AFTERNOON CLASSES**

**RESPONDING TO UTILITY EMERGENCIES-Natural Gas**

**FSC 623.001 Class is on Sunday AM (4hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to increase general awareness of natural gas at the scene; provide responders with specific safety skills to recognize and identify hazards and develop proper attitudes when responding to natural gas emergencies. This course will address the hazards, risks, response and players (utility and public service) involved in responding to emergencies involving natural gas.

**WINCH OPERATIONS**

**FSC 590.001 Class is on Sunday AM (4hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

Through lecture and hands-on integrated training exercises, this course will assist the student with safe and effective operation of a winch. Key safety elements will provide risk reduction strategies for maintaining a safe and effective rescue ground. This course was developed for rescue/extrication personnel exposed to winch operations for the purpose of recovery and stabilization. This course reviews strategic and tactical considerations for winch operations during an incident, inspection points for a comprehensive preventive maintenance schedule, and critical safety elements. Through integrated training scenarios, the student will implement lesson objectives.

**Fire Dynamics Fundamentals**

**FSC 0800.002 Class is on Sunday AM ( 3hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course provides the firefighter the basic knowledge to reinforce the evidence based research conducted by Underwriters Laboratories, National Institute of Standards and Technology. Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms and other fire service organizations. This course introduces new terminology related to fire dynamics, legacy verse modern fuel loads, new construction techniques, flow paths, door control, and ventilation that all impact fire ground operations.

**RESPONDING TO UTILITY EMERGENCIES-Electrical**

**FSC 618.001 Class is on Sunday PM (4hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to increase general awareness of electricity at the scene; provide responders with specific safety skills to recognize and identify hazards and develop proper attitudes when responding to electrical emergencies. This course will address the hazards, risks, response and players (utility and public service) involved in responding to emergencies involving electricity.

**Quint Concept: Strategies & Tactics**

**FSC 106.001 Class is on Sunday PM (3hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

Truck Companies, regardless of whether they arrive on an aerial device, squad, or engine, are the "combat engineers" of fire attack operations. Likewise, Engine Companies are the primary tactical suppression resource for the fire ground commander. This course is designed for experienced firefighters and will introduce the student to the basic concept of the quint company. Topics include: organizing the roles and responsibilities of quint company services, selection and use of key operational options, apparatus placement strategies, fire ground size-up and foreseeability, and operational considerations for the quint apparatus.

**Fire Dynamics Strategy and Tactics**

**FSC 0801.002 Class is on Sunday PM ( 3hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course provides the firefighter the basic knowledge of strategy and tactics and how to apply the evidence based fire research conducted by Underwriters Laboratories, National Institute of Standards and Technology, Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms and other fire service organizations to fire ground operations. This course introduces new terminology related to fire dynamics, ventilation, flow paths, door control, transitional fire attack, basement fires, and new concepts for developing strategy and tactics.

**SUNDAY 8 HR CLASSES**

**ELEVATOR RESCUE EMERGENCIES**

**FSC 0548.001 Class is on SUNDAY (8hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER**

**GEAR: HELMET, GLOVES, BOOTS, EYE PROTECTION**

Through classroom sessions and application exercises, this course addresses the procedures for preparing, assessing, and safe and effective rescue involving elevators. This course is intended for the technician level rescuer to give them the ability to function, accurately, safely, and effectively during rescue incidents involving this mode of public transportation. Topics include: hazard assessment and size-up, resource management considerations, equipment identification, types of emergency responses, patient considerations, extrication procedures, crush syndrome, lockout/tagout procedures, pre-incident planning, and application of techniques and equipment through simulated, integrated exercises.

**Vehicle Extrication Strategies and Tactics**

**FSC 2474.001 (Class is Sunday 8hrs)**

**PREREQUISITES: STUDENT MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES**

This course will provide an awareness level of information and skills as it pertains to vehicle rescue incidents. Topics will include general vehicle rescue function/operation; incident management of the vehicle accident/rescue incident; vehicle anatomy, design, and construction; recognition and control of hazards relative to a vehicle accident/rescue incident; and the tools and equipment used at a vehicle accident/rescue incident.

FLASHOVER RECOGNITION AND SURVIVAL IS A PA STATE FIRE ACADEMY ON THE ROAD PROGRAM. STUDENTS WILL EARN A CLASS CERTIFICATE FROM THE PSFA

FSC 900.001 Saturday March 16, 2019

FSC 900.002 Sunday March 17, 2019

**There is an additional 65.00 Lab Fee for this class that must be paid at the time of registration.**

**Flashover Recognition and Survival" (ZFRS)**— is an 8-hour course designed to give the student the practical knowledge required to recognize and understand the phenomena called "flashover", how to identify "pre-flashover" conditions and deal with these conditions in a safe and controlled manner. The ultimate outcome is to avoid firefighters from becoming victims of this violent phenomenon. Two live fire evolutions inside the simulator are required for successful completion of this course.

FSC 902.001 PREREQUISITES: PA. DEPT. OF HEALTH EMR,EMT,Paramedic

### Basic Rescue Task Force

This course is designed to introduce EMS, fire, and law enforcement to the rescue task force concept as it pertains to responding to active shooter scenarios or acts of aggressive deadly behavior. This two day course is will train responders personal safety, life-saving techniques, provider/patient movement, triage, and other important aspects of the concept. This concept allows EMS and fire to be partnered with law enforcement officers to enter secured areas and utilize their training to treat/transport injured individuals. This course offers both classroom and realistic scenario based exercises.

Junior fire fighters may not enroll in any course which involves live fire or live fire smoke. The Pennsylvania State Fire Academy policy on facial hair will be strictly enforced.

REGISTRATIONS FOR ALL COURSES WILL BE HANDLED BY BUCKS COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, YOUR EDUCATIONAL PROVIDER. The basic fee for the MAMA Emergency Services Training Weekend is \$70.00 which includes facilities, expendable materials costs, lunch and refreshments both days. Any student who is not a resident of Pennsylvania must pay an additional \$40.00 (\$110.00 total).

ALL REGISTRATIONS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CHECK OR MONEY ORDER DRAWN TO B.C.C.C. OR A CREDIT CARD ACCOUNT NUMBER (MUST INCLUDE 3 DIGIT V CODE) OR COMPANY/DEPARTMENT PURCHASE ORDER NUMBER.
