A.A. Social Services to Bachelor of Social Work Articulation Agreement

Summary

- This agreement outlines the steps for students who have earned the Associate of Arts Degree in Social Services at BCCC to transfer into the Temple Bachelor of Social Work program. Once students transfer to Temple University they shall be able to complete the B.S.W. program within four regular semesters of full-time enrollment, assuming that no remedial or repeated courses are needed, that the recommended courses are successfully completed, and all applicable Temple grade and other requirements are met to the satisfaction of Temple.
- Students who complete the Bucks County Community College curriculum specified in this agreement are guaranteed the transfer credit for courses indicated in that section, provided the courses are completed with a grade of at least C. Whenever possible, credit is allowed for courses completed more than 10 years before the date of admission.
- Students who transfer under the terms of this agreement are responsible for meeting requirements in their major field of study, and any other curricular requirements applying to all Temple students, that were in effect at Temple at the time of their admittance to Temple. These students will abide by the policies and procedures, and any revisions thereof that apply to all Temple students.
- Students entering Temple under the terms of this agreement must meet all regular Temple admissions requirements and all applicable Temple requirements and deadlines pertaining to application for admission and payment of tuition and fees.
- Students who transfer under this program agreement satisfy Temple Core Curriculum requirements according to the terms of the Bucks County Community College-Temple Core-to-Core Transfer agreement. Their Core requirements, except two Writing-intensive courses to be taken at Temple, are met by receipt of the Bucks County Community College A.A. degree.
- Students who take advantage of this agreement are also encouraged to sign the Dual Admissions Intent to Enroll Form.
