General Information

1. Is on-campus housing available for transfer students? <u>Yes</u> Cost? Varies depending on building

- 3. Scholarship availability for transfer students: <u>Transfer scholarships are based on academics and range from \$6,000-\$13,000 per year. We also give a \$2,000 scholarship per year to members of the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society.</u>
- 4. Can a transfer student with an associate degree normally expect to receive the baccalaureate degree in two years? It depends on the major and the courses the student took at Bucks. Design majors can take longer because of the sequencing of design classes.

Transfer Requirements

- 1. Best time(s) to apply? Deadline(s)? <u>Deadline for the spring semester is December 1st.</u>

 <u>Deadline for the fall semester is June 1st. We review applications after the deadline on a space available basis.</u>
- 2. What grade point average (4.0 scale) do you consider? <u>Depends on students major</u> Prefer? **Minimum of 2.50 GPA.**

- 3. If different averages are required for different curricula, please specify: **Varies depending on major.**
- 4. Do you accept GPA as calculated by previous college or do you re-calculate? **We accept** the college GPA.
- 5. Maximum number of credits accepted in transfer: 60.
- 6. When does the applicant learn which credits will be accepted in transfer? <u>Usually</u> within 2 weeks after acceptance.
- 7. Must the SAT or ACT scores be submitted by transfer students? Only if the student has less than 30 college credits or they did not take a college math.
- 8. Must high school transcripts or GED be submitted by students with an associate degree? Yes, for students that enroll at Jefferson, we require the final high school transcript or GED. We also require it during the application process if a student has less than 30 college credits or did not take a college math.
- 9. Is the transfer student required to have had the same high school courses (e.g. foreign language, math) as entering freshman? **No.**
- 10. Are D's transferable? With an AA degree? Without an AA degree? **No, we accept grades** of C or higher.
- 11. Do you accept Prior Learning Assessment (AP, CLEP, credit by certifications or portfolio, etc.) which may appear on the Bucks transcript? We accept AP/IB credits but we do not accept CLEP credits.
