Initial Diagnostic

Before starting to review concepts, EdReady™ asks users to complete a diagnostic assessment.

The diagnostic will:

- ▶ Assess student understanding
- ▶ Identify concepts that need review
- ▶ Provide a study plan

The time of completion will vary. Expect to take about an hour.

If you need to leave before your assessment is complete, your work will automatically be saved until your next visit to EdReady.
