

EITC donations at Bucks support three main K-12 areas within the theme of education, arts and culture, and enrichment

The programs supported include dual enrollment, which offers high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to take college-level courses at their high school or at one of the college's campuses. In the 2017-18 academic year, EITC funds paid for tuition and books for 11 three-credit courses in five high schools. EITC funds were also used to purchase books for 43 dual-enrollment students at Palisades High School and 22 dual-enrollment students at Quakertown High School. This past year, EITC funds supported dual-enrollment courses at seven high schools in Bucks County.





A second program supported by EITC funds is Artmobile, the college's traveling outreach museum. This museum on wheels allows children to explore new worlds while developing critical thinking skills and an appreciation for art. This year, EITC funds enabled more than 15,000 children from 25 schools throughout Bucks County to have an art museum experience at their school. For many students, Artmobile is their first, and sometimes only, museum experience.

Finally, EITC funds support the popular Kids on Campus day-camp programs attended by more than 2,000 children ages 5 to 16. There are 160 camps that range from sports, theater, and cooking to engineering, wilderness survival, and technology. EITC funds have been used to buy drones and iPads for STEM camps and to support children's theater camp productions of Peter Pan and Winnie the Pooh. This summer, the college is offering new Kids on Campus Leadership courses for high school students focusing on creative problem-solving and entrepreneurship.
