# Things To Consider

- Between 50-100% of your course work will be completed online. Do you have regular and convenient access to an Internet connected device?

Follow the information found in the Course Access section of the Faculty Syllabus. It will tell you which online course management system your course is using.

If your course is using the Canvas system and you are unfamiliar with it, prior to the start of your course please visit the Canvas Basics course (no login required) at https://bucks.instructure.com/courses/36545 to learn about Canvas. You will have login access to Canvas approximately two weeks before classes begin. However, access to your online class will begin on the first day of classes and not before.
