Academic Certificate in Emergency Management (CER.3179)

At Bucks County Community College, we use course-level assessment to determine student achievement of program of study goals, which represent the skills, knowledge, abilities, and behaviors that employers expect of program graduates. A series of courses prepares students for employment by providing preparation, practice, and opportunities to show mastery of these program of study goals. Each course is developed around a number of learning goals, known as course goals, that support a student's growing mastery of program of study goals. Faculty members assess each student's mastery of each program of study goal through specific assessments that students are required to complete in the courses. Each assessment is scored using criteria specific to the program of study goal being assessed.

Program Measure for Standard of Success:

• 75% or more of students will be successful in meeting the assessment criteria for each course-level assessment.
