Bucks+ is a co-curricular engagement program built into an app, designed to help you find and participate in activities happening virtually, on-campus, throughout Bucks County, and beyond! Students earn points for activities, event attendance, and accomplishments at varying levels. The program focuses on competency areas employers are looking for: Community Engagement, Financial Literacy, Global Awareness, Personal/Professional Development and Bucks Pride. #### How Do I Get Started?

Bucks+ is powered by Suitable, an education app and website that helps you track your progress through the program. You will use the app to check-in at in-person and virtual events using the built-in QR code reader. Any time you participate and/or scan into an event, your attendance is recorded, and points are added to your account. In some cases, you might have to complete a task before you see your points added to your account. You can check your Suitable account to see your total points, view the leaderboard & upcoming events.

Bucks offers competitive athletics through our Club Sport category, currently offering 8 club sports with the possibility of expansion. Club sports are organized by current students and are designed to be flexible with practices and competitions to meet the needs of the team members. Funding is generated by the teams themselves. Club Sports offerings are Equestrian, Volleyball, Running/ Track and Field, Golf, Tennis, Dance Team

#### Intramural/Recreation

If a Bucks student wants to play or compete among other Bucks students, the athletic department offers a variety of intramural teams and events each semester, which are free for students. #### **ADVISING**

Here are some answers to some frequently asked questions about advising:

## Why get advised?

Meeting with an advisor will ensure that you stay on track and take the right courses for your degree. You will be guided in taking electives that align with your course goals and prepare you for transfer to your desired transfer school.

## When should you get advised?

We recommend that you meet with your advisor every semester. Advising approval is required for fall and spring semesters. Advising for the fall semester begins in March and advising for the spring semester begins in October.

## Who is your advisor?

You will be assigned a faculty or professional advisor based on your major. This information can be found in Student Planning under Advising. If you are unsure, call the Advising Center at 215-968-8031 or email advising@bucks.edu.

#### How to choose classes?

It is important to choose the correct courses to avoid wasting money and time (but remember your advisor will help you with this). You want to choose classes that will put you in the best position to succeed.

Some things to consider are your work schedule, transportation requirements, access to technology, comfort level with technology, the time of day when you are most productive, and any transfer plans you might have after Bucks.

We offer lots of course modalities, and you can do any form or combination which works for you. Here are the terms we use:

Face-to-Face: Traditional courses that take place in the classroom; Hybrid: Course time is split between the classroom and online through Canvas; Online Asynchronous: A fully online course through Canvas. Synchronous via Zoom; A course that meets regularly online via zoom.



# What is the difference between full-time versus part-time?

A minimum of 12 credits in a semester is considered full-time at Bucks. Part-time is less than 12 credits. It is important to consider the number of hours devoted to homework, as well as the number of hours you work at a job, when building your course schedule.

Note: If your goal is to graduate within two years, we like to recommend students take 30 credits/year (in any sessions or combination which works for you) because we think it keeps students motivated and more likely to graduate - and well, we want you to graduate Bucks. However, we know each student has different circumstances, so we will always work with you. Be sure to have a conversation with your academic advisor to determine the best path for you!

#### REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

Once you meet with your advisor, remember you need to register for classes! This guarantees your place in the course.

Follow the registration instructions carefully, and complete all the steps, including the payment section.

You can adjust your course schedule until the semester starts without concern about losing money.

However, after the semester starts, you need to be aware of the drop/add timeline described in the Academic Calendar: https://www.bucks.edu/calendarnews/academiccalendar/

Depending on when you drop a class you can lose money. If you have financial aid, it is important to check with the Financial Aid office before you drop a class because it could impact your financial aid.

## Dropping and Withdrawing from a Course

We know whenever you start a class, you have every intention to complete it, but we also know sometimes life happens.

There is a difference between dropping and withdrawing from a class. If you drop a class, it will be removed from your schedule, and you will receive a refund. Refer to the Academic Calendar to determine the amount of your refund. The drop period is always at the beginning of the semester.

The withdrawal period is in the middle of semester. There is no refund, and a W appears on your transcript showing that you have attempted the course but withdrew. This will not negatively impact your GPA.

We recommend contacting your advisor prior to dropping or withdrawing from a course.

## **PAYING FOR COLLEGE**

Here are some of the ways students pay for college:

#### Financial Aid

One of the most difficult aspects of attending college can be figuring out how to pay tuition. The good news is that there are many options for receiving financial aid. These include grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study opportunities.

The first step is to apply to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, commonly known as the FAFSA Application. This is required for all students that wish to receive any assistance at BUCKS. The website to apply is www.studentaid.gov

We do have filing deadline; be sure to adhere to those established deadlines.

Student must also apply for PA State Grant assistance, after you complete the FAFSA you will be able to set up your account at www. pheaa.org and complete a short application for the PA State grant.

#### **Scholarships**

The Bucks' Scholarship program provides money to help students pay for their education by covering costs of tuition. Each year more than \$400,000 in scholarship money is awarded to students from all departments and programs. Unlike a loan, a scholarship award doesn't have to be repaid. Any money you are awarded this Spring will apply to your tuition for the 2024-2025 academic year. When considering your eligibility, note that scholarship review committees don't just look at your academics; they base their decisions on a myriad of things including: your major, community service, athletics, and financial need.

To view and apply for scholarships, go to *bucks.edu/scholarships* and log on to *ScholarshipUniverse*, Bucks' online, easy to use mobile-friendly platform. For assistance, look for weekly zoom workshops and Scholarship Days that will be taking place on all three campuses. You can even go to Bucks' Academic Success Center for help writing your personal essay that many scholarship applications require. #### **Out-of-Pocket**

# **Bucks Student Emergency Fund**

Students may apply for funds when they are experiencing a financial barrier or obstacle and have exhausted all other resources. The Bucks Student Emergency Fund was created by donations from alumni, employees, community partners, and friends to support your success. Funds are not given to the student directly; a bill or expense will be paid directly to the vendor by the Foundation. Students must complete an application and include documentation, such as an invoice or bill. This documentation should clearly include your name, address, account number (if provided), and provide instructions on how and where to submit payment. # 1. How do I obtain my parking permit?

# 2. How do I get my student ID card?

Submit your own photo through your Bucks email. Your ID will be mailed to you or available for pickup at the campus library of your choice. Follow the instructions at www.bucks.edu/library/services/faq

# 3. How do I find the books I need for my courses?

Books for your courses can be obtained at the Newtown Campus bookstore. They can also be found online on the bookstore website at https://www.bkstr.com/bucksstore/ shop/textbooks-and-course-materials. Please keep in mind that professors can change course materials that are needed so it may be best to wait until your first day of class to get your books. (Note: If you purchase your books before your first class, keep your receipts and do not break any seals on the packaging).

## 4. How do I grant my parents' permission to view my grades and/or financial information?

To release the confidentiality of your grades and/or financial information to a parent or guardian, you can log into Student Planning and from the student menu, select View and Add Proxy access. This proxy access to grades is limited to what students can see in self-service.

# 5. How do I drop a class?

If you wish to drop a course during the Drop Period, log into the Student Planning module and go to Plan and Schedule. The courses you are currently enrolled in will be listed on the left. To drop a course, select Drop. Please reference the Academic Calendar for refund policies for courses that are dropped. Please note: Dropping a class is not the same as Withdrawing from a class.

#### 6. How do I withdraw from a course?

If you wish to withdraw from a course, please complete the online withdraw submission form located on the forms webpage: https://www.bucks.edu/admissions/records/forms. We strongly recommend you talk to your professor, or an advisor prior to withdrawing. Please refer to the college's Academic Calendar and your syllabus for the due date to withdraw from a course. Withdrawing from a course may impact your financial aid, athletic eligibility and other school status. For questions about withdrawing from a course, please contact the Registrar's Office at registrar@bucks.edu or call 215-968-8000.

## 7. How do I change my major?

To change your major, you can go to: https://www.bucks. edu/admissions/records/forms/ You will see Change of Major form. You will log in and click Change Major, enter information, including your old major and what you would like your current major to be, type YES in the box at the bottom and hit submit. You will receive an email. We suggest a conversation with your academic advisor as well.
