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General Information

1. Is on-campus housing available for transfer students? **Yes** Cost? **\$11,500 (room and board)**
2. Full-time tuition: **\$38,616.00** Part-time tuition: **\$1,287/credit** Is evening tuition different? **Yes, if out of high school for 4 or more years**
3. Scholarship availability for transfer students: **Transfer Scholarship up to \$16,000/year based upon transfer cumulative GPA**
4. Can a transfer student with an associate degree normally expect to receive the baccalaureate degree in two years? **Yes, depending on the program. We have a policy that waives all liberal arts requirements at CCC if a student is transferring with an A.A. or A.S.**
5. Can a transfer student complete baccalaureate programs on an evening schedule? **If out of high school for 4 or more years.** There are select programs that are offered in the evening as well for both traditional and non traditional, for example Social Work.

1. Best time(s) to apply? **Rolling** Deadline(s): **Priority Deadlines: Fall is August 1, Spring is January 3**
2. What grade point average (4.0 scale) do you consider? **2.0** Prefer? **Above 2.5**
3. If different averages are required for different curricula, please specify: **2.7 minimum GPA in nursing pre-requisites, 3.0 min for Nutrition and/or Education**
4. Do you accept GPA as calculated by previous college or do you re-calculate? **We accept the GPA as calculated by previous college, and determine a final cumulative GPA in the case of multiple transfer institutions**
5. Maximum number of credits accepted in transfer: **60 credits from a 2-year college, 68 credits with an Associate's Degree, 90 credits from a 4-year college, 90 credits from a mixture of 2 and 4-yr. colleges**
6. When does the applicant learn which credits will be accepted in transfer? **A preliminary evaluation can be performed at inquiry stage, but an official evaluation of credit is determined after acceptance to the College (usually within a week)**
7. Must the SAT or ACT scores be submitted by transfer students? **No**
8. Must high school transcripts or GED be submitted by students with an associate degree? **Yes**
