- Students who do not earn the Associates in Social Services at BCCC will be required to complete Temple University's 45+ Core/GenEd Curriculum. Students should consult with their transfer counselor in selecting the appropriate courses.
- The BSW program requirements have changed effective fall 2008. Since the new BSW is 120 credits and requires fewer courses, it will be the more advantageous option for transfer students than the 124 credit program. Students transferring to Temple prior to Fall 2010, however, have the option of completing the requirements that were in effect prior to Fall 2008 or the new BSW program, as outlined in the above recommended semester plans. Students who choose to follow the old program will follow the above recommended semester plans, but they must complete additional requirements for the BSW degree. These include a History, Cultural Anthropology, upper level Political Science, and upper level Socio-Behavioral requirement. Students can select HIST152, SOCI120, POLI120, and PSYC200 respectively as part of their AA degree at BCCC to fulfill these requirements.
