Note 1: Penn State Abington's Letters, Arts, and Sciences or Psychological and Social Sciences majors are flexible. The B.A. degree requires 9 credits of B.A. Requirement in in Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences,

Quantification, and Foreign Language. Students in these majors (B.A. and B.S.) also take 15 credits of Electives. All Bucks courses in the Liberal Arts: Psychology Interpersonal Emphasis major, will fulfill a Penn State requirement for the Major, as Elective, or as B.A. Requirement, depending on the student's Penn State major.

Note 2: Penn State suggests taking any one of the following courses: VAFA 191, VAFA 192, VAFA 193, VAFA 194, VAFA 196, FCUL 110, HIST 111, HIST 112, HIST 151, HIST 152, HUMN 111, HUMN 112, HUMN 113, HUMN 114, HUMN 120, LITR 205, LITR 206, LITR 231, LITR 232, LITR 254, LITR 255, LITR 261, LITR 271, LITR 275, LITR 278, MUSC 101, MUSC 105, MUSC 106, or PHIL 125. See Note 1 and 3. **Note also** that these courses from the list above fulfill Penn State's General Education *and* U.S. Cultures requirements: VAFA 194, HIST 151, HIST 152, LITR 231, LITR 232, LITR 278, MUSC 105, or MUSC 106; and that these courses from the list above fulfill Penn State's General Education *and* International Cultures requirements: VAFA 191, VAFA 192, VAFA 193, COMT 101, FCUL 110, HIST 111, HIST 112, HUMN 120, or LITR 261. For the B.A. degree, Penn State requires **Foreign Language** to the 12th credit level, Language 202. Penn State Foreign Language courses are 4-credit courses.

Note 3: Keep track to fulfill Penn State Abington's **General Education requirements** for these majors:

- 6 credits in Arts
- 6 credits in Humanities
- 6 credits in Social and Behavioral Sciences
- 3 credits Health and Physical Activity
- 6 credits in Quantification (with at least 3 credits in Mathematics or Statistics)
- 9 credits in Natural Sciences (at least *one course* with a lab)
- 3 credits in United States Cultures, 3 credits in Other Cultures, *and* 3 credits in International Cultures can double count with the courses listed above (**example: U.S. History= both Humanities and U.S. Cultures requirement; any Western Heritage History = both Humanities and International Cultures requirements; SOCI 120 = Social/Behavioral Science and B.A.'s Other Cultures requirement**)

Note 4: Penn State requires 9 credits of Natural Sciences. Suggest any course in this list: BIOL, CHEM, PHYS, SCIE. Also note that BCCC requires a Science course in the Third and Fourth Semesters. For students planning the B.S. in Psychological and Social Sciences, suggest BIOL 181 and 182 to fulfill Penn State's anatomy and physiology courses (4 credits for Major and 4 credits for General Education: Natural Sciences).

Note 5: Students planning to enter Letters, Arts, and Sciences should take MATH 101, MATH 115, MATH 117, MATH 118, or MATH 120. Students planning to enter the B.A. or B.S. Psychological and Social Sciences major should take MATH 120; it is a prerequisite for Penn State's PSYCH 200 (REQ). Students planning to enter B.S. Psychological and Social Sciences should take MATH 120; it is a prerequisite for Penn State's MATH 110, Calculus (REQ). Also for B.S. students, MATH 117 and Math 118, *combined*, are equivalent to Penn State's MATH 110.

Note 6: Students planning to enter Letters, Arts, and Sciences may take any PSYC course. Penn State suggests that students planning to enter Psychological and Social Sciences should take PSYC 215, the equivalent of Penn State's PSYCH 200 (REQ), mentioned in Note 5.

Note 7: **Additional Policies:** Transferable courses **MUST** have a grade of "**C**" or **better**. Developmental and remedial courses are **NOT** included in transferable credit. Course work from another college or university **must be evaluated separately**. Penn State Abington's degree requires a **minimum 2.0 GPA** for transfer as calculated by Penn State. Before admission, students must complete certain high school courses, including math and foreign language. See psu.edu/admissions/.
