	Admissions Office in the Linksz Pavilion and request your transcripts to be sent.

•	How many credits will transfer into your program of study (major)?
•	For what specific courses have you been given credit?
•	What specific courses do you still need to earn the bachelor's degree?
•	Can any of the remaining courses needed for degree completion be taken at Bucks and transferred to "XYZ" university? If so, which ones?
